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Emerging

Emerging means your child is beginning to understand something in an area of learning. They are still learning but may need more support to move ahead. Emerging doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.

Developing

Developing means your child understands some things in an area of learning but still has other areas to work on. Like Emerging, it doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.

Proficient

Proficient is the goal for your child. It's also the goal for all students. When your child is Proficient, it means they fully understand the required learning. But it doesn't mean their learning stops.

Extending

Extending is when students show a deeper understanding. It's when your child is able to apply their learning in new and different ways. Extending is not the goal for all students in every area of learning.

Proficiency Scale

Core Competencies: Communication, Thinking, & Personal and Social

Learning these skills sets students up for success in school, in the workplace, and in their relationships with others



Video 2: Facets, Profiles and Connections

A Core Competency is made up of two or more sub-competencies, each of which contains smaller parts such as facets, profiles and connections. This video reviews the three broad Core Competencies and their sub-competencies and navigates through the Facets, Profiles and Connections tab for one of the sub-competencies.

Lessons from other Districts – 5 block model

Extended day timetable – 5 block model process overview

Positive:

Student schedules block 1-4 or 2-5

Bank time to have early dismissal X times per year for staff meetings

Negative:

Adds 2-3 minutes extra a day

2 start-ups/2 lunches (if desired) *divides staff, no consistency

Went back to regular schedule once space opened

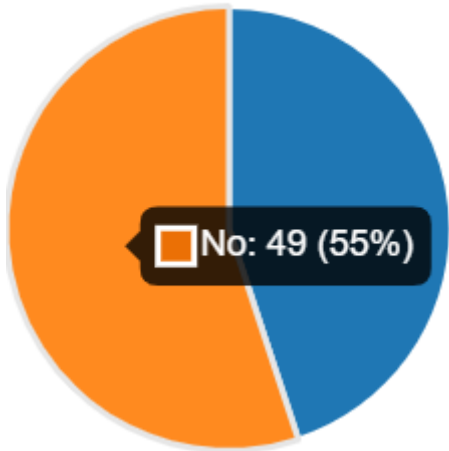
Union issues – split shift



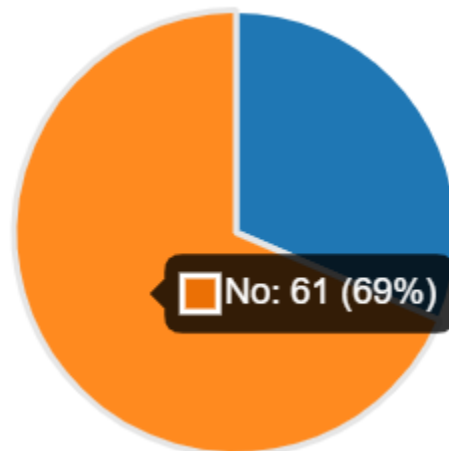

Teaching Before/After School Hours or Online

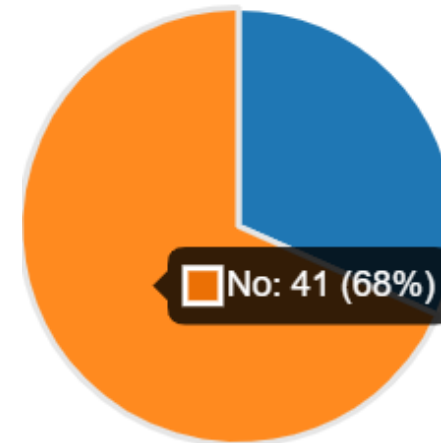

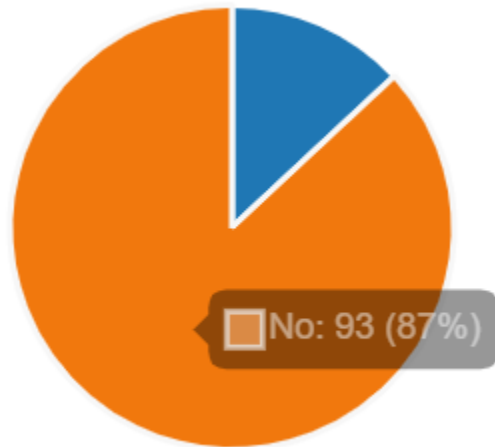

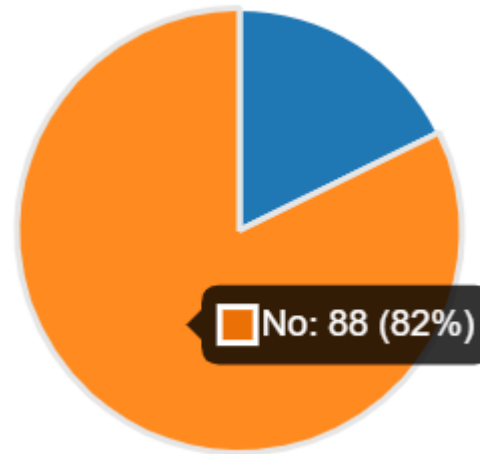
