Notes on admission: As spaces in the IB programme are limited, preference for admission will be based on a combination of factors. While academic ability is one important aspect of IB, students who are ultimately successful in IB have strong intrinsic motivation, demonstrate resiliency, and reflect the IB learner profile. Applicants should demonstrate these qualities throughout the application. Academically, we recommend students should have a B average in their academic courses, and a minimum score of 3 on the grade 10 literacy assessment. However, all applications will be considered.

 - o \$119 USD per exam (Both for Diploma and Course)
 - o Diploma and Course students taking 3+ courses in grade 11 pay \$500 CAD exam fee deposit.
 - o Remainder of exam fees paid in grade 12. (appx. \$550 for Diploma)
- Program Fees:
 - o **Diploma:** Grade 11: \$150 fee. Grade 12: \$200 fee.
 - o **Courses:** Grade 11: \$50 / course (up to \$150). Grade 12: \$50 / course (up to \$200).
 - o Program fees support annual IB World School fee, additional online tools and specific IB resources.
