### **Graduation Dogwood Diploma**

You need:

80 CREDITS

+

3 Graduation Assessments Written (4 if you are in French Immersion)

You require a minimum of 80 credits (52 + 28) to graduate. You begin earning credits in Grade 10 → Courses are worth 4 credits each

Of these 80 credits for graduation:

52 are required course credits (13 courses) and

28 are elective course credits (7 courses or more)

For French Immersion Students, there are 64 required credits to allow for the French language courses and 16 elective credits (total 80 credits)

For all students (English and French programs), at least 16 credits (4 courses) must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required English Language Arts 12 and Career Life Connections 12

In addition to 80 credits, you must write Provincial Graduation Assessments: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, Literacy 12; French Immersion students write a French assessment: Littératie 12





## What If I Did Not Pass A Course in Grade 10?

- If you did not pass a mandatory grade 10 course, you must redo it either next semester, in the summer, or next year
  - Mandatory courses are: Math, Science, Socials Studies, English, Careers, and Physical Education
- If you did not pass your language 10 course, you cannot do the language 11 course
   you must redo the language 10 course
- If you did not pass a course, you will not receive the credits for it

## Potential IB Students – Both Diploma and Certificate (Course) Options

- If accepted into the IB program, counsellors will be meeting with you for prescheduled interviews to discuss your IB courses and plan for next year
- Please fill out a regular course selection form just in case you are not accepted into the program or decide against doing it



### Things to Consider for Course Selection

- Although, it may seem early, it is important to choose your courses with your post-secondary plans in mind
- Consider your career goals → What type of job do you want?
- Are you wanting to go to a university or college?
  - Do you need a language 11 for admission?
  - Which level of Math does your university/college program want?
  - Do you need more than one Science? Which ones, specifically?
- Are you planning to do a trade, such as Carpentry or Plumbing?
  - Have you spoken with Ms. McArthur, the Trades Coordinator at NWSS?



### Things to Consider for Course Selection

- Keep in mind that Post-secondary institutions will be looking at both your grade
   11 & 12 grades when considering admission
- Post-secondary institutions value a well-rounded course load
  - You should avoid taking the bare minimum
  - It is recommended to take a selection of courses from various subject areas
- Post-secondary institutions like to see evidence of school and community involvement and volunteer work

- Your course selection form must be signed by a parent/guardian
- Selections must be entered into My Ed BC
   \*The online selections must match the paper selection form
- Return paper form to the Counselling Office (room 1102)
   \*Take a picture of it before you hand it in so that you remember what you chose



\*Please remember that just because you indicated on your paper form that you want to take an online course does **NOT** mean that you are signed up for it. **You must see your counsellor to be enrolled**
